### *Weeks 2-3*

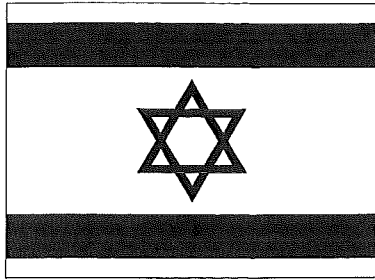
