Multi-national ministry started with \$27

Ann Dunagan, one of the founders of Harvest Ministry, continues to be amazed at what God has provided for that ministry.

She and her husband, Jon, founded it in 1987 when they were living in Bend. When it started, they were both in their early 20s and had \$27 to their name, she recalls.

Since then the couple, who now live in Mosier, have ministered in 70-plus nations and on all seven continents, including Antarctica.

She said Jon felt he was supposed to go there "to find a man running from God." He went there on a Russian ship and handed out Bibles to scientists working there.

He found the man he had the vision about and found that the man, a former missionary, was indeed trying to run from God, she said.

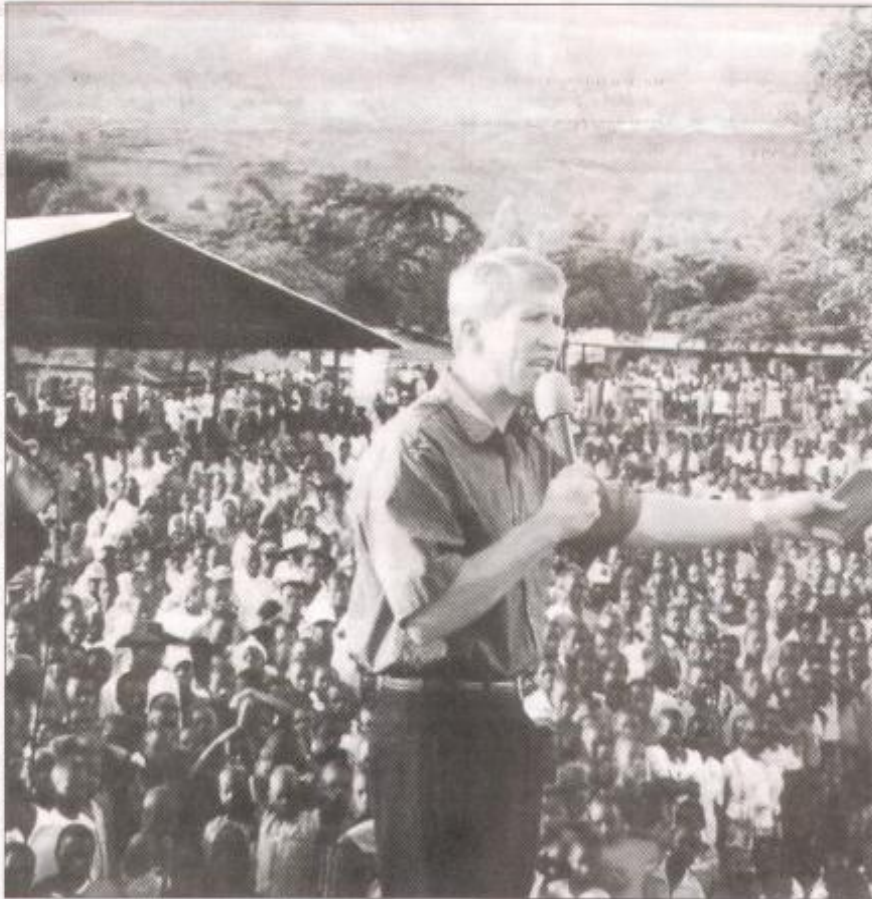
There are four main areas of the Harvest Ministry.

1. Remote missions evangelism. Members of the ministry team go into remote cities and hold city-wide outreaches. This is primarily in East Africa. Jon recently was in Kumi, Uganda near the border with Kenya.

2. Outreach NETS (National Evangelism Team Support). The team partners with national ministers to equip them to share the gospel. NETS does not actually start up churches but helps others do it and 400-plus churches have been planted.

3. Osanidde Village Orphanage, which currently houses 153 children. (See separate story above.)

4. Mission Minded Life. Ann has written two books, "Mission Minded Child" and soon to come out is "Mission Minded Family — Releasing Your

Family to God's Destiny."

Ann has been teaching a seminar at Covenant Christian in Hood River and will be speaking to home schoolers during the summer about Harvest Ministry. Recently she and Jon spoke at the local chapter of Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International and she has had other speaking engagements.

"We love what we do," Ann said. All of family has traveled with HM except for some of the youngest of the Dunagan's seven children.

On their website they say it is "our desire is to impart a fire for world evangelism, to inspire you [and your kids], and to introduce our ministry and family."
